by town and got Thelma and Gwen Burgoyn
Gwen took her ninth lesson and Helen her
second. we watched them sail around. Helen
enjoys it. Carl does not like it so well. He
thinks it is dangerous. Thelma did not go up
we were to be home and get H-D down to Tabernacle
by eight - were a little late and found little Sister
gone in the truck had taken Panorama and Helen
well we went down to the programme. It was

fine. Hazel Dawn came home in truck and
we stayed for the show "The Home Before Dawn" Then
had a root-beer float. Had a milkshake and came
home. A big day. I was very tired. It took me Thursday

and he hasn't really since he came from Cal.

your hair but I don't know when I will be
going down to do it.

That was nice of Aunt Ida to have you all
out to dinner. That was quite a hay rack
ride. You must have had fun.

When you write to Gareth tell him to get
acquainted with Uncle Harry. Don't
know just where he is but he goes to London
often. I have been going to send you the
letter I got from Gareth but haven't done so
but will soon of Thursday. (9 likes 12 in back)
Helen handed her contract back to G.J. Winters
unsigned. It makes me feel bad. And I
think it gives Helen a funny feeling.
I wish we all knew what to do for the best
at all times. The girls are so very busy but
they will write soon as they can. I would
glad if Carl can come home. Had
