I should do so I would not feel like I had
done I feel impressed to write you to
night although I have no news to tell
in particular it may be that I have been
thinking of you & the boys a great deal
since I came back and am a little
lonesome to night - at any rate dear
Ara I shall sacrifice a few moments
of my slumbers to give you that joy you
so much look for & so dearly appreciate
seeing that I cannot give you the real

necessaries of life at present I will
try and give you all of the comfort I
can by writing you as often as possible

We are to have a triple wedding
here before long Jim Sparks George Dock
& Will Bates. Bates has been rebaptized
and all of them expect to go through
the temple - Well Daisy I am fairing
better now than I did before coming down
I have gained 9 lbs. I had one of the
chickens when I come home there was nothing
to eat so I had to kill one I now have
Lade up milking her I got one lb. of butter
of Mrs. Nowland I can tell you things
looked dismal on my return & I did not
feel I did not feel much like coming in
I hope ear long this kind of a life will
end I have been thinkin of getting a
job in the round house & have you come
up as soon as your term is out & keep
house for me we all could live as cheap as

I could board but I guess I will not be able
to do that as I will have to go to Mont. I
have a letter from a lady agt. there that is
to work under my management and the
house has also made arrangements for me
to look after their territory they seem to
want to put me at the top before beginning
They are sending all letters to me from applicants

The word of Payne
come more forcibly to me to night than
I have had them for sometime. Home,
Home Sweet Sweet Home. There is
no place like home. I wish you
were all here to night. I would like to see
you all ever so much. Home is not home
to me when all are away that I love
so dearly. The 4 walls and all that
is between them have no seal appearance
of home when I come in. They seem
like I can't tell what all seems
strange to me in general. Now &
the boys are away that must account
for all I guess at any rate you
shall have a good home some day before
long. You are a good wife and deserve
it & shall have it too (sheet No 3 to
come)

sheet No. 2.

I did not tell you I had a letter from John
Ream & enclosed one from Mast - one he
wrote to me well he wants to sell for the note
he says he thinks Larson & I am working
a game of some kind that he has not heard from
him for some time he offers it for \$20
less than it calls for & have just written
home & made an offer for it - I think will work
all right John is teaching the Union school
folks are all well

I was at the dam yesterday
and got a nice load of wood some that
come down the river from railroad bridges
being repaid. Well to day ends another wk.

not being ready to go to bed I thought
I would write a word or two I have been
scrapping to day & my feet are tired I will
tell you a little joke that happened to me
this morning I have Lades calf up now
and this morning I thought I would lead
it to water so I put a rope round its neck
and took it out to water when I opened
the gate he shot out and before I could
stop him he took me right into the
pond I had my old Danish shoes on

and they had no heels on so I could not
stop & when I got out a few steps of the
pond my feet slipped from under me &
I slid right into the mud and water
up to my arms I got wet all over & got
my pockets full of mud but I stayed
with the calf I thought of Roxie I
did not skin mine but got mud on
it — Cooles have been branding
to day and I did not find it out
till late this evening I shall go
to morrow I wish I was through
that job Well I am getting
sleepy & will quit If you get
this in the evening read it about
10 P.M. & think of a big hug and many
