Dear Dad and Mother,

I have been expecting you to come to the ranch most any time, for a long time now. I am very sorry that mother's health has been such that you could not come. As far as climate is concerned it surely has been pleasant, but ~~the~~ country surely is a wreck.

Since early in March we have ^{had} practically no moisture, altogether probably would not have wet two inches in the ground. All the water that has been available for irrigation since April 15th is enough to water the wild hay on the lower forty on the home place fairly well, and about 10 acres of grain once, now the water is shut out of the ditch. I doubt if Duayne will pull a mower on the Larroux claim, this year. He says he does not expect over 200 tons of hay altogether, and he will get most of that on the Folie claim where he is pumping water.
