FORESTRY WEEK TO BE CELEBRATED

Idaho will again celebrate forestry week. It has been officially proclaimed by Governor Chase Clark for the week of April 27 to May 3. Last year's commemoration was very successful.

According to word received, Richard Walton, a sophomore art student at the University of Idaho won first place in the college division of the forestry week poster contest. Second prize was awarded to Mary Elizabeth Brown of St. Mary's. The next two posters were of such equal merit that both were awarded third prize, and they were Lois Ream of Dingle, and Mary Virginia Birch of Spokane.

The winning posters are on display in the lounge of the student union building. The poster submitted by Richard Walton will be used for advertising forestry week.

There will also be a series of radio broadcasts sponsored by the University of Idaho, School of Forestry. The first broadcast deals with the values of range management. It will be broadcast over the following stations:

Missoula, KGVO, April 18, 10 to 10:15 p. m.; Lewiston, KRLC, April 18, 8:30 to 8:45 p. m.; Spokane, KFPY, April 17, 7:45 to 8 p. m.; Boise, KIDO, April 14, 8:30 to 8:45 p. m.; Twin Falls, KTFI, April 18, 9:30 to 9:45 p. m.

A second program will deal with the values of wildlife and recreation and will be broadcast the week of April 21 until April 26. The third program will be on logging and silviculture, and will be broadcast during forestry week, April 23 to May 3.
