Dear Beams: -

I'm going to leave here the 28th and drive thru to Washington D.C. with a friend of mine in his car. He has a 5 passenger Gardner, new, so we should have no trouble.

I had a letter from Swift the other day. He wants me to come down and see him but I don't think I can cut it if I go with this friend of mine because he is an old man and could not stand the drive alone. If you should by any chance want to go, come on I know it would be o.k. with him as we are looking for someone to go with us and help drive. We leave here early Monday the 28th and go to Chicago and then to Danville Ill and from there its a paved road all the way to Wash. We expect to be gone at least 3 weeks. It will be a fine trip. If you could get away I'd say its some trip.

I had an answer to my cable to Mamula. I cabled that I would go back under contract for \$8000 a year. They cabled back that they would let me know by Sept 15, so I don't know what they will do though my boss, - Williams promised to get it for me
