Dear Mother:

I do not remember when I heard from you last but I know it is time past when I should have written to you.

K.D. got home a week ago and I have been sick with the flu ever since.

Nov 18

Well I did not get to finish this letter. Something stopped me and I just have not got at it since. I am not over the flu yet. The last week I have spent most of the time in or on the bed. I have just done what had to be done. Yesterday and day before I got M.A. to do my feeding. To day I went out and helped feed but am not very well yet. My lungs seem to be clearing but I still have a bad head.

It looks as though spring were not far off. Most of the snow is gone but we have a little added every day or two.

I havent done a thing on the house for a couple of weeks. But must get started again soon so I will have the lotting done when spring opens so I can plant. I hope to be ready through in time to put in the crops. That wont take long this year then
(over)

I will finish the house and summerfallow
after that. It will sure seem nice to get
up out of the ground.

The cattle are sure doing fine, but
there are not as many calves as last
year. They may come later. It sure feels
fine not to have to lamb this year
but I will miss the wool money. All in
all I am glad I do not have the sheep
to bother with.

I hope you are well and that Jean is and
I hope family are too.

We have all had colds but I am the only
one that has been down.

Phyllis Lyons Koume died yesterday.
She was operated on for a goiter some
time ago and has not been well since.
But it seems to have been a rupture or a
bad case of asthma. When she got right
had them took her to Soda Springs and she
was unconscious when they got there and died
soon after.

Get Jean read this letter, I will
write to him later. Hope he is doing
well in his work.

just below the eye. They took
him to Logan — He has to go again

town — been to a party in
the 2 Ward. I did not stay for
the eats. Daddy was too sick to
