It quite a sight to see you should come home & see them. There were 4 big men & see them yesterday. Say they are a wonderful sight nicer than last yr. Mr. Gov. manager of the Poultry & egg Co. was one of the men here & he advises killing $\frac{1}{2}$ for Thanks having $\frac{1}{3}$ for Xmas & $\frac{1}{3}$ for Jan. He said he could kill some now & he could find a market for them. Well this is enough Turkey. They all are disappointed at you not coming home. Am I glad things are looking as good as they are. I am pretty sure the Co. will get the loan on your Home stead in Prop. Just try & see if you can't make the deal on 929. I am progressing nicely on things here. everything looks good for me to come clear & get 500 head of stock to feed up my hay will have between 800 & 900 tons extra the best crop ever seen 13 T. but no sale for it. Getting on fine haying. Just two boxes out side of the family

is all the help we have 8 or 10 more stacks & we will
be done, no frost to hurt yet. but, very dry & sandy.
Indian Summer is on. Well I am out a lot
drive my car every da. but - don't feel any to good now
I find an old cripple is out of place where ever he is or
goes. Am sticking as hard as I can. There are some
things that has to be done & I'm not sure that I'll
make the grade it seems a lone fight. but, I know I am
right & want to put it over. But is a?

I see a no. of people that ask about you & tell how
as I'm getting nervous Well quit now & finish in
the morning Good Night

Step 2, Well I was not so well yesterday so did not write, Am
a little better to da, R.D. & I are going to m. this afternoon. He will drive as I
don't care to. We are doing fine haying considering such a small gang
has been a fine yr. for haying, not enough rain to stop a day yet.
Fall is here and Indian Summer too. The sky is smoky smoky the
most smoke I have seen for yrs. nights are getting cooler, the driest
season I have ever seen in B.D. Jil moved his breeding pens & pens yesterday
& has been camping with them 2 nights will put a man out to day. His
birds sure look good. It cost 9¢ a lb. to raise them and all over is a
profit. if a bird weighs 20^{lb} @ 9¢-180 to raise & if he can get 20¢ a lb.
20x20 is 400-180=220 profit 15.00 it will give him 3800¢ above
cost of raising. so he will do pretty good even if they weigh less
he takes less per lb. He will be the only one that will make any money
it look like the rest are working hard & it look like they will get nothing

Well you had better arrange to get home for a short stay. I think it will
be worth your while. I feel pretty sure you can get fixed up on the
stuff. and I do wish could do as well on 929. see if Mrs. C -
will take Government Bonds at 4 1/2 per - she might & make the
change. I will be needing you to sign papers for the refinancing
If you come I'll see if I can't have them ready by the time you get
her. I will get both deals off Monday & it will take about 2 or 3 lbs. to get
them back. See if you can't get here by the 10 or 15.
