DEAR STOCKHOLDERS:

THE ANNUAL STOCKHOLDERS MEETING OF THE GENERAL STEAM CORPORATION SHOULD BE HELD THE SECOND SATURDAY IN NOVEMBER. THAT OF THE COUNTERFLO HEATER COMPANY SHOULD BE HELD THE FOURTH TUESDAY IN NOVEMBER.

IT HAS BEEN DECIDED THAT A JOINT MEETING OF THE STOCKHOLDERS OF BOTH COMPANIES SHOULD BE HELD AND THAT SATURDAY THE 14TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1931, AT 4:00 P. M., BE THE TIME. THE PLACE: THE COUNTERFLO FACTORY OFFICE BUILDING, AT 1937 SOUTH 2ND WEST, SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH.

WE HAVE VERY WEIGHTY MATTERS TO CONSIDER. WE HAVE MADE CONTRACTS WHICH WE AGREED TO PUT UP TO THE STOCKHOLDERS TO RATIFY OR REJECT. THEY ARE VERY IMPORTANT. THEY INVOLVE THE FUTURE OF YOUR COMPANY. WE WANT YOU TO BE PRESENT. YOUR JUDGMENT AND YOUR VOTE ARE NECESSARY. THEY CANNOT BE DECIDED BY YOUR DIRECTORATE. IT IS POSITIVELY NECESSARY THAT EVERYONE BE PRESENT.
