Dear Dad & Mother,

I found your letter when I came home and was glad to hear from you. I thought maybe I would see you in Long Beach while I was there but when I heard that Mother was hurt and could not travel for a while I gave up hope. I hope Mother is entirely well by now.

That \$145⁰⁰ was supposed to be in your account but they made a mistake at the bank so I am sending them a check for your account and hope they get it right this time. You should have the deposit slip before the end of this week.

The \$214 was correct when the 1938 taxes were added. The other was only delinquent taxes.

Everything here on the ranch is fine. The other mare did not have a cold but the one you have is doing

fine and so are all the other horses.
The cows are doing all right also. The
corn is in the shed and the fruit is
all right except the apple butter is
moulding and the plums that were
not canned have all gone rotten. As
far as I can see things are going
pretty well. Rodney still has a
bunch of turkeys to kill yet.

I sold five ⁽⁵⁾ calves today for \$150.⁰⁰
My chimney is not finished yet so
have not taken any pictures of it. I am
working on the windows now fitting
them and making the frames.

Every one and everything seems to
be doing fine.
