Dear Dad,

Was glad to get your card
I know all are well down there. We are
all ok up here in spite of the pneumonia weather.
That one minute & cold the next. The snow is
nearly all gone. If it stays this way we will
be creeping by Mar. 1st

Due to a miss statement in your taxes the
loan has been delayed but that is straightened
out now & I think the money will soon be
here. After the taxes & installments are paid
do you want the remainder applied on the
forgotten note or elsewhere.

I am enclosing a new note and
mortgage to be signed. Return them to me
and we will sign them & send them to the
bank.

We were offered 3.75 for the steers
but did not take it. I told the buyer to
get in some good quality steers weighing 700 lbs
& less then we would trade with him pound
for pound. W.H. & M.A. that that would be
ok & the buyer seemed interested.

There is a fellow in Montpelier who
wants to sell his sheep at five dollars per head.
There is about 300 head. W.A. & I plan ongoing
down & look them over. I may win you before
this reaches there. If I don't let me know what
to do in case I can pick up ^{some} ~~any~~ thing good.
Wool is selling at 30¢ per lb. which would put
the actual value of the sheep at about \$2000 dollars.
not bad if they are good young sheep. It is a forced
sale.

I sold six head of hogs today at \$550 each
They weighed 145 lbs on an average. I still have
seventeen & that is plenty.

Am going to sleep while writing
so will close wishing you all the best.
