Dear Mother,

I was glad to get your letter & to know that you are all doing fine down there. We are all ok up here. I have just as much to be thankful for. Rodney is starting to kill his turkeys this morning even tho the price is low.

Till Dad I will write him as soon as the Stronally cattle get here and give him all the particulars he has asked for. I will sell no more hay until he tells me to. The Glare-valley men came over the other day & paid \$1045⁰⁰ & will pay the rest when the cattle are brought over. I paid the interest on the notes at Lezilliere C. Barber & \$20⁰⁰ to Thiel & Hester. I have on hand now \$950⁰⁰ & there is \$950⁰⁰ yet to be paid when the cattle arrive here.

We were offered 9.75 for the steers with six cut back at 9.00 the other day but did not take it. I can trade hay for some young steers but don't know just what kind of a trade Dad would have

we make. I think \$500 for the hay & 2.50 for the
cattle would be about the deal I could make.

I had a bean dinner at M.A.'s Thank-
sgiving & hope you had as nice a time on that
day as I did.
