I haven't written to you

either. On the 22 of May our  
teacher went to Bantoc. We  
had a new teacher. She was  
very strict. No one liked  
her very much except that  
when we were having recitation  
she let us look in our books.  
We have ten chickens.  
One rooster and nine hens.  
We get about six or seven eggs  
a day. The horses are fine.

We gave Bepher away about  
a year ago. Silver is well.  
Mora and I are the only people  
that can ride Windy. I learn-  
ed when Mora had the measles  
and couldn't ride. I had to  
ride Windy and I ~~think~~ think  
it's a lot of fun riding.
