Helen went in to see Aunt Norma's baby last night. She said the baby surely is cute. It has blond hair and blue eyes. Aunt Norma is getting along fine.

I think spring is coming at last - I hope, I hope, I hope. In March we had enough snow, slush, and mud to last me for a good



long time.

Tell Mary Ida to hurry up and answer my letter. I'm trying to find out how she is getting along with tall dark and handsome. Hope she is making some headway.

Dad and Mom just went to church. Helen and I have so much to do we stayed home to try to get caught up.

When we took Ramona home from the Crow, we got stuck. It settled in so far we couldn't get it out, so we left it till morning. During the night it froze so hard that a team couldn't even budge it. It took a week for it to thaw enough to get it out.
