Saw man in the 89<sup>th</sup> Light Infantry  
Division. We will have 2 weeks Reserve  
training and then will then join  
the 353 Infantry of this division. We  
will then join the division on their  
maneuvers, which began on April 27.

at apt date we will move away for  
either amphibious or air borne training  
we are now taking mountain training  
about 30 miles north of Rabat. We are  
away out in the middle of nowhere  
we are sleeping in tents and getting  
plenty of sleep but it is rather cold.

You can blame this rather letter  
on both me and the lousy writing  
conditions.

Enough for now. The candle  
is burning low and it is our  
last one.
