Dear Dad & Mother:-

Hope you are all doing well now. We are all well here, and everything is going on as well as could be expected under the circumstances.

We are through lambing and just finished shearing yesterday and will take sheep to the hills today. We should have been out a week ago but could not get the shearers. We will not have as much wool as last year on account of shearing earlier and not having been out on grass.

The lamb crop is fair but we are losing some on account of not being on grass. I should have gone out and sheared later but M.G. and J.P. had a lot of maggots and had to shear.

We have had little rain here and things are getting quite dry.

I have not got my cropping done yet but expect to do it soon now.

I don't suppose we will have much
of a crop on the irrigated ground this year.
There is about five or six second feet in
your ditch yet and the boys are getting
a little irrigating done. Grass is growing good
but would do better if there was plenty of
water.

We have not got your abstract completed
yet, but expect to have it done soon. There
by the time you get home the other papers
should be here.

and hope mother, that you continue to
improve and that you both will soon
be up here.
