July 18 1935

Dear Grandmother,

I received your nice letter and have been going to answer it ever since I got it. I have been sick in bed a day and the next day I pitched hay all day even though I didn't feel so good. I have been working since and now I feel as good as ever.

I wonder if you saw the total eclipse of the moon on the fifteenth. We did. It was full moon and the eclipse was total. It was nearly a sight. I stayed up until after it was all over.

I went to Georgetown Sunday with Dad. He took Clifford Sigma, the bird man, and we saw his folks and friends. We had seven

plate and bought a new tire.
We were going to see about
about buying a riding horse
but the horse and owner was
not there. I think we will go
again soon. The other day
Oleg Dayton and I built a
raft and rowed across muddy
lake. We used the raft to
work on in cleaning out a pipe
to drain the lake so we can
hay. We couldn't get it all
cleaned out. There was sure
a strong suction and we
were careful not to fall in.
It would just about take a pole
out of our hands. Grandpa
watched and helped build the
raft. He is getting along fine.
He was surely disappointed when
you did not come with us.

He doesn't feel feel so good
about Rosy leaving you. Why
didn't Alta let her mother know
before she went down to Long Beach
or else wait a little instead of
such a rush.

I am sorry about mrs. Jansell.
I guess I did not see mrs.
Wymer.

I wish I were down there to
help with the yard. It is too
hard for you to do much. I am
glad you are taking your bath
and walk. I believe it is doing
you good but don't over do. I
wish I could see the neighbor
and say hello. Tell Don & Joe
hello for me.
