How are you & how is everything doing. Are you in Long Beach or up to San Leandro. This is the first chance I have had to write for a long time. I certainly have been on the go. I have been working as night watchman and janitor at Keith O'Brien store every night for a little over a month, a 12 hour shift & also going to school. I have been pretty sleepy getting from 2 to 4 hours out of every 24. Well, now I work Saturday & Sunday nights so it isn't going to be so bad. I hope you have a nice time on Mother's Day which is this coming Sunday. Wish I could come down and say hello to you but I guess that is impossible. I am thinking of staying here



in Salt Lake and going to  
Summer School. I haven't  
decided for sure yet though.  
I am trying to get the place  
here fixed up. I guess you know  
that we moved. I like this  
place much better. It has such  
a nice big yard and is in a blind  
street so there is very few cars going  
by & the neighborhood is nice. It  
is only a block south & half a block  
East of the other place but it is  
certainly nicer for the children.  
It is a nice large old-fashioned  
house & we have a gas furnace  
& a gas range & I think it is  
very much nicer. Alwe do is  
regulate a dial to have the amount  
of heat we want. We have to watch  
the boys to see they don't turn on  
the gas but they have a nice yard  
to play in & don't bother the gas.
