Four more days of stacking will finish for me. Then I will be getting in the grain which is nearly ready.

I expect to start the house in about a month. I have most of the lumber now.

Mamma's mother came a few days ago. she will be here for a month or so I guess.

Helen's friend, brought her up and Jean came with her, but stayed only a day then went back with Carl and on to the coast. They are trying to get a job in some defence work.

I paid the Federal Farm Loan installment on Aug 1. Ida's part is \$49  $\frac{86}{100}$  I will be able

to use it as soon as she can send it. But  
it won't hurt much if she can't send it for a month  
or two. But by then I will be running close.  
We are figuring on sending Mary Jane  
to B. Y. U. when school starts.

We have done no more on the vault yet  
and don't know when we will. It looks  
as if I will have to hire men and do  
it my self if it gets done. You say  
that it is no body's fault that it did not  
get done. Well, I think it is. When a  
person makes a definite promise to do

excuses to not keep it. And that is  
what hapened here. I have put in  
enough time to have had it finished  
if the others had cooperated as they promised.
