Dear Dad,

I got your letter some time ago, but have been so rushed that I just have not got at answering it. I have been trying to get things done up for winter. I am pretty well ~~not~~ caught up now. I have my grain all in and a hundred acres seeded to fall wheat. I have started to plough. Have about sixty acres to plough but it won't hurt much if it has to wait until spring.

Mamie has been in Salt Lake taking care of my mother and Emilie, for two months. I am going down after her today. Will be back Monday.

About the ditch work, I was having it raised from the hill to the hed gate. But when they came to work on it water had been out so much that it was too wet, so I don't know if they will come back to do it. It will have to be done in the spring if it is not ^{done}.
I hope you are getting well and that you had a good time on ^(over)

your birth day.

I heard from mother the other day
she did not know if you were coming
down there or where.

Well you may be there before you
get this letter.

I guess M.A. + Cabb had a swell
time down there. Wish I could have
come. Maybe next year. I hear
that they will likely have the
Fair open for a few months then.
