Well things are going along pretty good up here. While we are feeling everything it does not take so much because they do a lot of grazing. The weather is mild and no snow. Once in a while a little falls but it usually gone by noon.

I had to move the sheep out of Pine Springs a couple of weeks ago on account of snow. It was about two feet deep up there.

You probably heard about Arthur & Jimmie dying, heart trouble & dropsy. Thom. Calentum is in the hospital now very sick.

Jean will not be home for Christmas as he has a job in Salt Lake for part of the holidays
(over)

but we expect Helen will be here about
the 24th.

Our school here is only out for one
week.
