He thinks he will hear from yours and the others before long. Sarp he will write to you in a few days. Kenneth & Joe Lriday have been going to the canyon for some time. They went again this morning.

Wesley & Mitchell are going up to cut more mahogany Sat. That is such a hard job I don't like to have them go. Wesley has got a big pile of cottonwood from down in the grove and a burn fire. He is going to get some willows. It seems lonesome with Gran up to the ranch. He went up on the mts. Well stay till it snows. We got a nice letter from Helen. She has had her tonsils out, and said she just missed one day of school. Says she is alone so much at night but that she does not mind it.

We got a letter from ^{Bell Bloomer} Arizona saying that one of Father's sisters died. She was Joe Lewis' brother's wife. She had a large family - they were all married. She had pneumonia.

The new house across the way looks quite fine now. They will soon have it finished. They have the water in and seem to think that Ted is a very good hand. It is dandy weather for them and they almost work night & day so as to get done before it snows.

Wish we could come down and visit you for a while. I guess Ricky is a big fellow by now. Tell Mother Ream I will try to write soon. I wrote to Beulah and Ruth.
