Hope you are improving still and will soon be able to come up here. We have summer here now for sure. The hedges and trees are beginning to leave out. The grass is growing fine, but we will have to have lots of rain if we have any crops or pasture. K.D. Has water on the meadows but I suppose it will soon be taken away.

Dingle Irrigation Co. as usual let water run in ditch all winter, then shut it out when they should have been starting to irrigate.

Well, I have been lambing for a little more than a week now and have 91 lambs. I am about  $\frac{1}{3}$  through.

I will not be able to put my crop in at Pine Springs for a while yet but have got the ground nearly all prepared now.

Trall wheat came out fairly well, though some of it is so weedy that I may have to  
(over)

lick it up.

I got a letter from Sargillie the other day and he said that he had sent sad papers to fix up and had not heard from him yet. They should be fixed up, as the Federal loan will be some time in closing yet.

We are all well here and I have enough to do to keep busy.
