Shesly has been, and still is sick but trying to fence and do so much when he should be in bed. I have been going up to the ranch every day with him to try and help. He seems glad to have me. I am still tired - the roads are awful they are working on Indian Creek - you can hardly get by. We are sure proud of our graduates this year. Have had so many thrills and a grand time. I wish you could have been with us. Will tell you all about it when you come. Mother was glad to see us all. She seemed a little better. Don't know when she will come up here. It was sure hot down there one day. The rest was cool for my benefit - I guess.

Harvey seems to be a little better. But we don't think the Dr. knows what the trouble is. He was in the hospital nearly three weeks. We went to see him last night. He looks better than he has. But he can't sleep or eat much. and still has a lot of pain.

We think Ruth's hand is getting better slowly. She has a treatment (electric) nearly every day. Well Shesly is ready so I must go. We take our lunch and have a good time. The wild flowers are lovely. It is a pretty time at the ranch.
