I am feeling a little better each day. The cast was taken off on the first. It seemed awful could not move my foot or leg at all and it seemed dead we tried working it all we could now we can bend the knee about five inches and can move the ankle but it hurts a lot. My leg aches and pains, some nights I can not sleep.

Helen came Tuesday - we were all glad to have her. She looks fine. But can only stay a week. She will ^{be} working in the library and expects to make enough for her tuition.

We expect Jean the last of the week. We think the folks will come and bring him. It is hot down there - Mother wants to come home. She is better but has been sick this Spring.

Wesley needs Jean. He is going to ranch to plant fall grain. The hay will soon be on. The lilacs are very new and the lily hill is covered. They bring loads in every day. Wish you could see them. I hope you and Ida can come before they are gone.

It is fine for Dad to have the phone in. We can talk when we want. He hasn't been able to come down much, so we visit over the phone. We haven't any garden. I sure wish we had. I thought sure we would have one this summer.

Sam Nute died. Funeral today in wardboro.

It is hot days here but rather cool nights.

Mary, Ida & Hazel & Aven have had a hard time going to school and doing the work. Will be glad when I can get up. They need so much sewing. We hope you can all come up for a while at least. They all send love.
