Dear Dad:-

I got your card O.K., but seems that we are going to be unable to get any thing from Java as no one has time to go after it.

We are all way behind with our work. M.A. and I were heading and threshing when it snowed. I had my wheat in and had 500 bu of barley. I have 15 acres of barley out and had about 35 acres. We have been down nearly a week now. We are going up to try and get the rest of it in the morning. If it will stay good weather about three days we will be through up there. The crops were very poor this year, badly frozen.

I have a lot of farm loan work piling up on me. I should spent three or

trying to collect. The bank has turned
over a dozen cases to me. I get 3% of
what I can collect.

The bank sent another application
for Cook.

I have been trying to get
hold of a little money to send down
for Jean but have not succeeded yet.

know the boys are working
too hard. I really wish they could
get a good job out of this cold
weather. Kenneth's back is
still bad he has been to the
Dr. again. I am afraid he
