Dear Mother:

Just got your last letter last night.

The other one came two days ago.

Sorry that no one wrote to me before. I have been going to buy, have been putting it off from day to day. So much so that when I get into the house and sit down it is just too much effort to move until I have to, but I have had a terrible cold for a week now. Don't know what I would have done if Jean had not come home and helped me out a few days. He had a few days of pain, sleep and back ticks home. He is going back to day.

It was on March 19 at night that Mamie went into the kitchen to get some milk for supper. She slipped and fell and pulled a rope down on her. The table had four or five hundred pounds of curing meat on it. It broke her right leg five or six inches above the knee, a serious break. It took her to the hospital that night but they did nothing until the next morning. Then they put her in 14 hospital on her foot and kept her there for three weeks. (over)

Wednesday they put the cast on. They seem to think that it is almost a perfect fit. But she will have to wear the cast for several weeks. It may be a week or two yet before she can come home.

We have been having a wonderful winter this year, the worst of it came between March twelfth and April 6th. It snowed every day, just enough to keep snow in the pit like it was on the 12th. But it is quite gone and lambs are doing fine. I am less than half a hundred out yet, but there has been very little loss.
