Saturday Jan 11<sup>th</sup> 1870

Dear Sister Maria yours of Christiana  
morning received some time since.  
was very glad to get it. also glad  
you were all well. we all had sore  
throats just now and it seems  
there is not many in Logan but  
what have! you say poor little "puny"  
Mitchell weighs 30 pounds. I was  
astounded for that is all Pagan  
did when baby was born but  
I think <sup>he</sup> would go at least 35  
now for he is fatter and heavier  
than Aunt Lizzy's Willie.  
Is it not too bad about poor sweet  
little Hazel? and poor Lydia. I  
think the poor soul must be nearly  
heart broken. I could not go up  
to the funeral for my own soul

Ladies sake you wanted to know  
the particulars concerning par charge  
well all I know is he went to  
Priso and was charged with Murder  
and the time of trial is in Feb-  
some time he had to employ  
two Lawyers (Mormons) and they  
said it would cost him at least  
\$1,000 and maybe his life in the  
bargain but he was let off on  
bail and George and Charley  
Hancock was put in prison to  
await the trial as they would  
not trust them on bail.
