Dear Will - while the children
are all asleep I will try and
write you. We are all well - I
suppose that is the first & most
important point to you. Every
thing seems to be going along
all right here at home. The
day you left it snowed seven
inches but we did not think
the roads hardly good enough
to bring a cord of wood from
M - so Eph got a small load
of split wood. The weather is quite
cold now, freezes hard. The eve-
ning of the day you left Stella
gave birth to a little girl, it

lived several hours - but managed
every breath. I was not up there

had been up & gone home so
I went up the next morning to
see how she was. I made the
carried clothes for it & then I
went to M - with A. C. L. instead
of taking a train. They buried
the baby Sat. Stella was quite
sick the second night.

I took down some cheese to
Burgoyne store & got the children
each a good pair of shoes when
I go again I think I will be
to get me some felt shoes they
have them there.

I expected sure to get a card
from you yesterday but I was
disappointed. As I hardly know
what to do, I don't know whether
it is too late to ship to Miles or
not. I think I will do it ten times
