Dear Daughter

Mara I will try and write you a few lines this evening I forget wheather I answered your last letter or not I have misplaced it so I cannot find it but I know that I never have heard from you since you was sick in bed I am very anxious to know if you are well do try and write if possible I hope you all are well can little Miss Ida walk a lone yet Delia baby walks a lone and gets into every thing they are all well only E. M. he has been very sick but is better We are all as well as common Abner is getting better she is up a round the house a gain I suppose you have heard a bout her house

hacking fire it was the roof to her
old kitchen Roxie is not very well
but the rest of the family are all
well how is the weather now in
Bear Lake it is fine here but we
have had two cold nights here lately
so cold that it froze ice as thick as
window glass you remember that
little calf we had when you was here
when it was four or five weeks old
Henry sold it for veal and got three
dollars for it the old cow has a
jersey heifer calf Fleets heifer has
a black heifer calf five days old
I make between 2 and 3 pounds
of butter a week just from the
old cow the two calves takes all
the milk the two heifers give
for our cows are very poor they
have had no hay since you was here
so you can see that they would do better
if they had more to eat there is
not much for them to get in the

pasture well Ohara your Father
has gone to bed and it is getting late
and I am tired so I will bid you
good night and will try and
finish this in the morning

May 4th all well I cannot think of
any news to write it is a little windy
to day you must kiss the children for
me I wish I could see you all I hope
Will has better health than he had
when I was there. Do you make lots
of butter to sell now have you got any
little pigs yet How are Willie and
Stella getting a long I never hear
from them only when you write they
do not think enough of me to write so
I have to depend on you to know how they
get a long Did Fabian get homesick
while you was here I expect the children
was awful glad to see you Love to you
all and please write soon to your
loving mother
