I only have a pencil
but I must write just the same.
I arrived all OK as expected, only 20
minutes late. Miss Poock met me.
She has been wonderful to me.

woman than I but quite good

nice altho I am a much younger
(^{more} "youthful") individual than she expected.
She hopes I ~~retreat~~ ^{retract} my friends
amongst the supermen and
rule with a heavy hand and
much love at the same time

I was never so flabbergasted
in my life as when they
turned me loose over there
yesterday AM. To-day I was
the only supervisor in the
building for 3 hr this PM. 2 hr
of that time the superintendent
was out, so you can imagine
about how I got there.

There are 3 floor supervisors
there are never more than 2 on
at a time in the PM & seldom more
than one, so you see we have
the whole house at that time. &
the Supt. is off on a long day -
half day he said I would soon
find myself in charge of the whole

shebang. When she told me
this she looked at me in pity
and hoped I wasn't frightened
to death. My heart fluttered a right
but I laughed & told her I
was sure that in a day or so
it would be a simple matter.
Everything here is so strange I
know I'll never be used to it

we have good meals & they
are nicely served. In my room
besides my bed & dresser I have
a book stand, chair writing desk
& desk lamp, chair & a large rocking
chair. The bell is right over my
door so I have no trouble in
waking up in the AM at 5⁴⁰ + 6²⁰
