it from Frank

When I came back from home they  
were going to have a fishing party  
my cousin and I were invited to go  
with them I never enjoyed my  
self better while they were all  
fishing gathered shells untill we  
got tired of gathering them then  
we took the boat and went up  
the river one mile and a half  
I love to be on the water  
we lie close to four rivers

North river South river Mitchell  
river and the Upper Mainer river  
it is the largest of the four it  
was the Upper Mainer that we went  
fishing in I have never read  
Oliver Twist but Mr Webb  
has he thinks, since I love good  
Literature reading I will not  
write more to day
