make here work for me &  
they will be ready when  
I want them. Well I

small affair as "dress".

I was quite frightened  
when John told me of your  
escape from an accident  
in the canyon. I hope you  
will have as good luck in  
escaping all danger.

Miss Clara Rice  
will take my school. She  
came up last Monday
