Dear Mother Team:-

Last nite - as usual he was busy until so very late - didn't get home to eat until 7:00 - tonight office night so I thought I would substitute for this time. (I must not leave him for long or he will forget me altogether - the way his

work takes up his time.)

Melle said that just as they were leaving last morn a boy came in - had been almost scalped - accident - riding a bicycle. It was a

long, tiring sewing job for Douglas after a hard day.

Mother - I am so very busy too - no girl as yet.

I have a lady come in one day a week who helps clean upstairs and does part of the ironing. I "tried

out" an elderly lady. She was a good worker, but talked all the time - telling us all her troubles. We were all annoyed. I am on the go every minute. I gener-

ally do mending at night  
if I am not too tired.

I just returned from  
taking David to school.  
He goes to afternoon kinder-  
garden and thoroughly enjoys  
it. ~~He~~ Seanore calls for  
him and brings him  
home after school. Next year  
she will be at another  
school - he will be able to  
come home alone then.

Ueldon just woke up  
and thinks I should come  
up after him. I hoped  
I could get the finished  
first. He is just as active  
as ever - requires an alert  
watchman all the time.

This afternoon is sunny and nice outside - not windy. Aren't you rather tired of this continual rain? I am kept busy running a taxi when the rain is falling fast - taking the children to and from school to keep the dry.

We are all well and do hope you are just fine - also Ida and family. We will be happy to see you anytime you can come.

What is the latest from Beulah? We were disappointed last Sun A.M. We went 36 miles (to & from)



to talk to her. via amateur  
radio - but he couldn't  
make connection. We  
saw Milton + Helen for a  
min. Milton left in a  
hurry for the Hospital  
and Helen said she had  
to much to do at home to  
stop and talk to us. She  
has a lady coming every  
day - by the day.
