Each day seems to bring new problems
& I'm now so far behind in some of my work
that I may never catch up unless I work
much harder.

I had hoped to tell you on the 10th, for there
was a medical convention at Pasadena & I was
planning on going down on the 8th but just
before leaving I had a case of a ruptured
appendix. As I had to operate at 8:30 instead
of leaving at 6:57 P.M. The patient is doing
nicely so I am pleased in that sense, though
disappointed at not seeing you.

The most recent news from Dad is to the
effect that he was doing nicely & that everyone
else is well, up there.
