trip, & the writing up of our notes,
etc.

especially as in addition to paying my
parting respects I desired to know
whether it would be agreeable to you
for me to open a correspondence. So
having been so unfortunate as to not

I should feel myself highly complimented & greatly honored; but if you have any reasons for not desiring to correspond, I shall not be offended though I would be much obliged if you would simply drop a line in answer to this so that I may have the satisfaction of knowing that it reached its destination, a slip simply saying "Willsville" will accomplish this latter object, though I earnestly hope I shall have the honor of receiving a letter in return. I hope you will not think me presumptuous in taking the liberty of asking the favor of your correspondence, for while our acquaintance ^{ships} was certainly not very long, it certainly was very sweet & pleasant & do not see why it should terminate so abruptly by my leaving Willsville when it can be continued through the medium of the U.S. Mail.

On the evening of the same day that we left Willsville, Mr. Webster & myself went to a theatrical performance at the Logan theatre which passed off very nicely & was highly creditable to the native talent of Logan. On the following week we went to Brigham City, in Box Elder County, where we did some surveying
