I am improving. Let me ask you

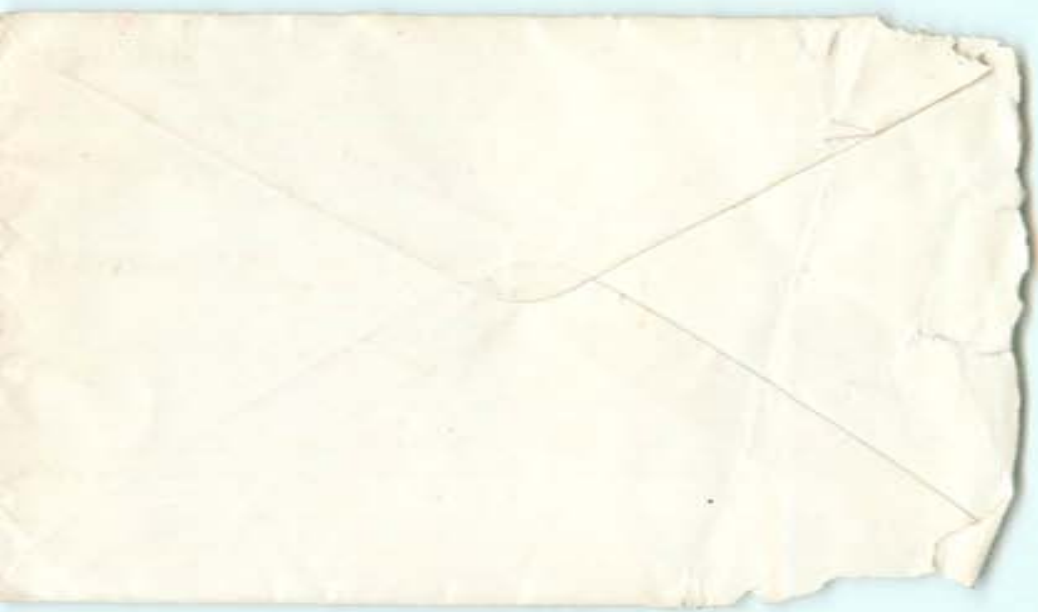
do I improve in writing do I
