

St. Charles Idaho
Ollahone September 30, 1888

My dear Nora it is
improper for me to write so often but as I
have nothing to do and alone I will spend
a few moments in writing to you I am
still staying at Mrs. Pugmills have a good
place and plenty of books to read have
been reading all the afternoon this
forenoon Mr. Frank Larson called
and we had a pleasant time Frank
and I will bid you soon (surely) if I don't
come it will not be because I do not want to
for I would much rather come to see you
than any other person in the world I
really feel lonely and homesick since
I left Logan I am almost ashamed
to say but never the less it is true
Mr. Larson and my self have been
talking of taking a trip into the Mts.
next June if all is well We will call and see

National Park, and several other noted
places before we return. This is our
anticipation if it never comes to pass
I expect to call and pay our friend
a visit before I return.

The folks have come home
and are talking to me so I cannot
write any more at present will finish
to night. Have a little head ache
this afternoon will close for the present.

Monday morning

October the 1. 1888

Dear friend I was taken
very sick last eve. and failed to
write so I will finish this morning.

We had a very heavy wind storm
accompanied by rain which makes
the valley look gloomy to day.

I am expecting a return to day
in R. P. of L. I managed to get 44
orders last week want as many
more this week.

Will Howard I have made the acquaint-
ance of a very nice young lady here
in this place her name is Luanna.
Don't you think that it is a fascinating
name I think she is a nice little girl
(but not as nice as mine) her eyes are
black as a coal and snap like a bat.
I am going to leave this place
tomorrow will stop at Blainville
for a few days. You may add the
answer of this note to Paris. That is
if you think it worth answering.

When I commenced writing yesterday
I had intended writing a long letter
but circumstances would not permit.

Hope you will write when you have
time and I will do the same.
