My Dear Son

Just finished  
my dinner my horses are feeling  
well so I will write you a  
while resting in the shade on  
my saddle & blanket. I am  
not well, was very ill yesterday  
& stopped at Alfreys <sup>place</sup> today  
I am all alone think where you  
are it must be nearly time  
for the show. Yes I see you  
going with Mr. Fish, so  
I turn my head & think  
of the ranch. Tired & sick  
I saddle & am ready to  
start so go I hope today  
will write you at Linton  
ranch tonight

Saw at Mrs. Grotz's it as  
early but I can't get through  
the canyon so I will stay & go  
a fishing first we will get  
some Hoppers. Just back from  
I have caught some have had  
supper & ready for bed, still  
not well. I have thought of  
you many times to day. Good  
Good Night & Pleasant  
dreams

Thursday at Meadow  
I am now at Mrs. Grotz's the  
cows are all gone & the women  
are very busy. I have  
the best year - The young  
Hoppers quite a coming today  
I come from Grotz's with  
meowing @ distance of 25 m  
must go & see Mrs. Grotz  
Good afternoon - Don't  
make Irish Hare to night

Here at my destored place  
had & hungry every thing  
had ~~some~~ return so I take  
garage & what you have  
had a pleasant trip through  
the canyon & saw snow in  
sight of the ranch (I  
don't like to tell you what I saw  
coming through first a bear  
then a fawn & just coming  
out of the canyon at Meadow  
I met a large hawk  
he looks like he thought I  
was intruding & did not  
dispute him for I was  
saying he should rise there  
I am staying with Mrs  
Mrs. Shirley very nice  
& Mrs. They were up late  
last night & want to  
return so fare well

 this morning? Not very well, but  
 think I will feel better when I
