the valley. The stream

E. St. Austin told me he
counted 23 shocks from
the ft. till morning
the ft. being near two Cts.
He said there was a sound
something like distant
cannonading preceding &
following the shocks. In
myself I only felt 5
distinct shocks, that
morning, but many
since, almost every
day since, I felt two
this morning, one about
3 & the 4-15 quite hard.

him on returning I wanted
to get up early & do some
work I had to do before
going away & would
like to use a quite early
he said it was all right
but on returning he could
not sleep & got up & lit
the lamp & read quite
a while then blew out the

my horse was down waiting
quite a while I got up &
could not find a lamp
so I thought I would
go down to the barn
& see my horse anyhow
I found him all right
when I came back I
lit a match & look at
