Dear Sister Anna

Yours of the 29<sup>th</sup>  
at hand and contents read  
with pleasure.

This letter  
leaves me well with  
the exception of a head  
ache which I have nearly  
every afternoon lately. I hope  
it will find you all well.

You asked me why I do  
not come home & get a  
school to teach. You say I  
could make more money  
and not work so hard.

Well perhaps I might but  
still I had to laugh when  
I read that for I have not  
done any work for over a

month, or at least the hardest  
work I have done is walking  
altogether in one day maybe  
two miles and writing about  
an hour. so you see I do  
not have to work very hard  
and I do not know how  
I think I am getting  
about sixty dollars a month  
& Board. But for all of  
that I would rather come  
home & get a school if I  
could. but I do not know  
that I could get one  
if I did come home.

Q. Why doesn't "Kille" teach  
in Bear Lake this winter?

I have about fifty  
names enrolled in my time  
book now most of which are  
Italians. One of the white  
men disappeared yesterday

It is with pleasure that I sit down to write you a few lines to let you know how I am getting along. I am well at present and I hope this letter will find you all the same.

I was surprised to hear you was teaching in

Preston, I hope you have a  
good success.

I wrote to you  
in Logan but I guess you  
did not get it. I have plenty  
chokecherries up here but I  
tell you it is an awful  
lonesome place for me.

There has only been one  
person here from Utah besides  
myself and that is Jim  
Ingall Peterson so you see  
I do not have much company.

Tell will that I wish he  
would answer that letter  
I wrote to him while he  
was in Bear Lake and I  
wish you would ask Geo

and Emma why they do not  
answer my letters for I have  
written to each of them <sup>and</sup>  
have not received an answer  
from either.

This is all I  
can write this time.

Hoping to hear  
from you soon I will  
close.
