Dear Mother:

I got out of Idc. at about eleven o'clock  
the night that I left there. I should  
have got out at five fifteen but there  
were too many waiting. After standing  
for about an hour and a half the  
buses were all filled and they announced  
that the next bus would leave at nine  
forty five. After sitting down and resting  
for a couple of hours I got in the  
crowd again. After being in the crowd  
for another hour and a half I had  
worked up to ten or fifteen feet from the  
door. When they called the nine forty five  
bus there were about three hundred people  
in the jam. The sweat was running down  
my face and I was squeezed in so tight  
I could scarcely move. By the time they  
had loaded out three buses I was getting  
close to the door then they said that  
the next would be at eleven forty five.  
Quite a few people could not stand it  
any longer and moved out that let me  
a little closer. At about ten fifteen they  
(over)

got some more buses so I managed to get started.

I got here a little before one yesterday and went up to Milton's office. There were about a dozen people waiting to see him and more coming all the time. After I had been there a half hour or so a girl came out and asked if I had an appointment. I told her that I was his brother and that he was not expecting me. She took me into his office and told him there was a man to see him as soon as he could. After ten or fifteen minutes he came in. He was surely surprised to see me. He got rid of those that were waiting as quickly as he could and we came home to lunch. I left until he was ready to go out on night calls, then I went with him. We got back about one o'clock.

Helen was here. She said she had planned to go for a vacation but that the children were not well enough to permit. So she had given it up. She seemed glad to see me, and the kids were too. Susan said I looked a lot different to what she remembered me. I guess they are all as well as usual now. They are all up and around.

I called Doyler last night. They are all well and asked about you. This letter will be for my ~~parents~~ ~~and~~ ~~you~~ ~~and~~ ~~the~~ ~~needed~~.
