Dear Mother Beane

Thanks for your kind letter it came Friday just as we were ready to leave for Salt Lake. It made Mother feel so happy to have you say she could take the beds to Salt Lake. We could not take it then but will send it. It was sweet of you to send word back ~~soon~~ soon. We left at 1:30 P.M. Friday. Put mother in the front seat. She stood the trip fine but was sea sick, it was a lovely day. James went with us to help. We came back Saturday left at 4:30 P.M. gather at 8:30

Jean was glad to see me his hand  
is better he will have to keep the cast  
on till the 18 then they will see  
if they have to put another on.  
The bone in the wrist by the thumb  
is broken and there is also a crack  
The Dr thinks it will be alright.  
I sure hope it will. Ruth's hand  
is about the same. The Dr is  
stumped, He has given her some  
medicine and wants her to go back  
again in two weeks. We are so  
worried about it. It feels hard.  
Mary Ida broke her glasses and  
I took them down to be fixed.  
I guess it is a good thing that  
we took Mother when we did for it  
was such a lovely day. and when  
we came back we ran into a

snow storm in Logan Canyon  
and it has been snowing and  
blowing and very cold yesterday  
and today. It sure feels like winter.  
We <sup>got to</sup> went to Sunday School & Church  
yesterday. Presby went to the ranch for  
a load of wheat then he took us down  
to meeting at night. When we  
came home it was snowing  
hard. The girls are here fixing  
this dresses the bus goes at 12:30  
for assembly. and a foot ball  
game at 2:30, but I don't think  
they can play in weather like this.  
I wish they didn't have to go.  
Emeline and children are fine. The  
twins are going to nursery school  
at the U. Virginis - Edna's sister  
calls for them and takes them in  
her car with her little boy. They  
go at 9 and come home at 3:30

They have a hot lunch and a nap.  
The dropped out is the reason  
they got in. They are happy about it  
and little Warren wishes he could go.

Carol Lynn can walk she looks so  
cute - she goes very carefully and  
hasn't had a fall. The boys are so  
thrilled - they say "Stand up and walk,  
if she gets on her hands and knees.  
We are sorry to say that Chesley lost
