admires my knitted piece.

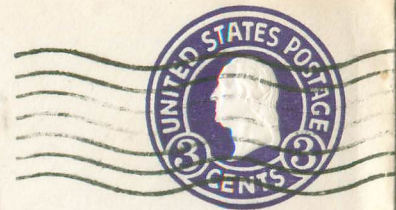
