We are all fine here. I hope you are too.

We are having bum weather here. Wind for a day, and wind and rain for two days. It is the second and worst(?) typhoon we had this season. I go barefooted outside instead of wearing boots and things. They bother me.

I brought some sunglasses yesterday because too much light hurts my eyes. I cannot read in a room with very bright curtains either.
