and not enough time to work out-  
side. I think I ought to get  
the work done inside first.

I hope I can go to Bear  
Lake this summer - take the  
children. They haven't been  
for two years. I had thought  
of going for Decoration Day,  
but have decided I shouldn't  
take the children out of school.  
They would miss two weeks -  
will try and go later if I can  
get someone to stay here.
