Have been sneezing and had a head-ache most of the time today. Have done some reading & have thought a lot about you & wondered what you were doing. Wish you would come and visit us. Hate to spend the time going and coming or would drive down & see you. May do it anyway.

We have had some cold days but it started raining last night & has been let it off & on all day today. I'd surely be glad when this war is over so that I can take a rest - and I am really going to take one too. Would you like to take a trip somewhere then - & if so where? Let's plan something shall we?

How are you getting along alone? Hope you don't get  
too lonesome. How often do you see Ida? Give her  
& family my best & so it cold down there too.  
Have you heard from Jean? Let us have  
another of your ~~wonderful~~ letters.
