party. It was a good party lots of food and
fun.

I had a good time at Miltons. Could
scarcely get away. They kept wanting me to stay
longer. Just a week ago Milton took me to
San Francisco. We went over all three bridges
and spent the best part of the day dining around.
I intended to leave Monday but was sick
so did not leave until Tuesday morning. I
did not have any trouble getting off. The bus
was not crowded when I got on but filled up
at other stops. I had intended stopping at
Salt Lake but when I got there, decided to
