Dear Aunt Ida,

I am here in Salt Lake after a nice trip. We were just comfortable during the night. not too warm nor too cold. I had breakfast in St. George about 8:00 a.m. Then after we left there it was plenty warm but we opened the windows and the breeze made it nice. The roads were in good condition. Near Provo they are fixing the road but only for about a half mile. That is the only place. There wasn't a detour. Mother is here at Aunt Em's and will stay here and ride up with you. Helen went home yesterday at 2:00 P.M. before I got here. So Mother will ride home with you instead of Helen.

I arrived here last night at 6:40 and walked out to Aunt Em's. I think I will leave tonight for home. The Card Grandma wrote just arrived this morning. I am going to go downtown with

mother and see if we can find
anyone that is going up home.

Those sailors that were on the
bus got drunk but they arrived in
Salt Lake all right. I rode with a
fellow from Long Beach and we
had a good time. Two girls sat
just across the aisle. One was
going to Boston & then by boat to
Nova Scotia. She was traveling
straight through. The other one was
going to Omaha. They were nice
and we talked & had a good time.

They were both from San Diego &
had just graduated from High School.
There was three busses & they
were all filled.

Bring Grandma up with you. I
think she will be all right. Mother
says Grandpa has had the place cleaned
up already. Stop here at Aunt Ems.
Write & tell mother what time you will
be here. The address is 430 South
11 East and they have a telephone
now the number is: Hyland 5800-W

I will be expecting you soon. There is
two small houses that are similar side by side.
Aunt Ems is the one on the south. It is on
the west side of the street. Love to all, Jean
