It looks like spring is "just around the corner". It has been raining just a little for two days now and the snow is going fast. It is hard to get along with sleighs now. But I suppose it will snow some more. I hope it does. It will make feeding easier.

There is little news here. I hope you are all well there. Give my love to all.
