Dear Mother;

I have been going to write for several days but have just not got at it. I suppose that you have received the announcement we sent to Ida, by now; a girl born on the 9<sup>th</sup>. 8 pounds + dark hair blue eyes pointed chin and big nose. She was long and slim but is now content and growing fat. Mamie is doing quite so well but not as good as with the last ones.

We got the little thing alright about a week before it happened and Mamie was very pleased with them.

I have got slighted out on the grain deal alright and that we reweighed came out as I claimed 2000 pounds more than the slips. I have paid most of my debts except Douglas and Rodney. We have sold the cattle and my share when I get it will settle with them.

I left about 1500 bushels of grain  
to feed and seed. Mitchell and I are  
going to feed beef this winter.

We just pulled the trucker home  
a day or two ago and I'm "glad" for <sup>it</sup> ~~it~~

We have had winter here  
since the first and it sure looks  
as though it would be a real one  
this time. But I guess you are pretty  
well fixed for it though I did not  
get nearly the work done that I  
expected to.

We are now loading the oats then  
K.D. and I will go up to Pine Springs of there  
or found and fix things for the winter
